



Meeting of the Selection Board for EFSA's Stakeholder Consultation Group for the review of the Bee Guidance Document

1. Background

In March 2019, the European Commission (EC) mandated EFSA to revise its 2013 guidance document1 on the risk assessment of plant protection products and bees (*Apis mellifera*, *Bombus spp*. and solitary bees) (EFSA, 2013), which was republished in 2014 following feedback from MSs collected during a workshop organised by the EC.

EFSA has considered both the complexity of the subject and the stakeholder and public interest of the subject in question, and has decided to establish an ad-hoc stakeholder consultation group composed of relevant organisations that will be consulted at various stages of development of the work to provide input to the EFSA scientific working group.

A call to EFSA stakeholder organisations for nominating stakeholder experts to the ad hoc EFSA Bee Guidance Stakeholder Consultation Group was published on 8 May 2019. The deadline for applications was 21 May 2019.

2. Applications

Nineteen (19) nominations were received. According to the call, a maximum of fourteen (14) Stakeholder expert representatives would be selected from the nominations. The secretariat distributed, before the meeting a list of received applications, which are summarised in section 3.

4. Selection criteria

The selection followed the principles established in EFSA's Stakeholder Engagement Approach and the Decision of the Management Board of EFSA on the criteria for establishing a list of stakeholders and the establishment of the Stakeholder Forum and Stakeholder Bureau.

In particular, EFSA considered the following:

- Interest in the field and expected benefits from the participation of the organisation as expressed in its application;
- Role and remit of the organisation at the EU level;
- Achieving a balanced representation of stakeholder interests;
- Knowledge and expertise of the nominated stakeholder expert, considering the need for the Stakeholder Consultation Group to cover a range of technical and scientific areas including environmental risk assessment, bee biology, agronomy bee health.

Upon the analysis of the 19 nominations, the selection committee unanimously agreed on the selection indicated under section 5. For the organisations not yet registered as EFSA's stakeholders, the selection is pending on the confirmation of the eligibility criteria for the organisation.

It is worth noting that, for the non-selected organisations, several channels – including public consultations and open plenary meetings of EFSA's Scientific Panels – remain open, should they be interested in interacting with EFSA.

In addition, non-selected organisations could be invited to contribute to the process via selected stakeholder organisations representing their stakeholder category. Finally, depending on the nature of the issue, EFSA has the discretion to invite those organisations to participate as non-registered stakeholders in targeted engagement platforms that may run in the future, where their specific expertise may be useful or where they could benefit from our work.
